## Course Overview:

Start your career in barbering with this part time course for adult learners. Develop industry skills including including cutting men's hair and facial hair using basic techniques, creating patterns, perming, and communication skills to take your career to the next level.

## What's Covered:

Learners gain essential barbering skills through a blend of practical training and theory. Guided by highly experienced tutors, they work with real clients in the salon to develop technical ability alongside customer service and the professional standards expected within the industry.

The topics you will cover whilst completing the course include the following core hairdressing topics:

- Establish effective working relationships
- Advise and consult with clients
- Shampoo, condition and treat hair and scalp
- Dry men's hair
- Cut men's hair using basic techniques
- Cut facial hair using basic techniques
- Create basic patterns in hair
- Perm hair

Upon completion, learners are equipped with the knowledge and confidence to progress within the barbering industry.

## Entry Requirements:

There are no formal entry requirements for this course, however you will be required to attend an interview.

## Assessment Information:

You will be assessed through a range of practical assessments and online exams.
