Course Overview:

Do you enjoy drawing? Could you tell a story using moving images? This fresh and exciting course will support you in a journey that encourages creativity and ambition. Immerse yourself in a captivating world of visual storytelling with our A Level Illustration and Animation course. This dynamic program combines traditional drawing techniques with digital animation skills, allowing students to explore a range of creative possibilities. From character design to narrative development, students develop the skills and techniques to bring their ideas to life through illustration and animation.

What's Covered:

We recognise and celebrate the diversity of all the young people we work with and we'll show you how to draw upon your own personality and experiences, helping you to find a meaningful form of personal self-expression which will provide a constant focus throughout the course.

Skills covered include:

- Practical Research & Development
- Curiosity & Creative Risk Taking

- Drawing, mark making and image making
- Painting Media & Techniques
- Collage, image transfer and mixed media
- Printmaking & digital editing
- Photography & image manipulation

The course has a very strong skills focus, developing not only the practical subject specific creative skills, but also the employability skills essential for progression into the Creative Industries e.g. problem solving, idea generation, literacy skills, presentation and communication skills, time management, team working and independent thinking skills.

The curriculum is designed to be challenging in order to build resilience and stretch you to achieve your full creative potential and enjoy your studies.

Entry Requirements:

In addition to examples of your creative work, you will need a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above, in subjects relevant to your A Level or A+ Programme subject choices. This should ideally include English Language and maths as well as a creative subject, however we actively encourage interested learners to apply and attend an informal interview to allow us to find out more about you, your career aspirations, predicted grades and creative ability.

- 1. Personal Investigation (60%) a major in-depth critical, practical and theoretical investigative project based on themes and subject matter that have personal significance, including an extended written element (min 1000 words) related to your practical investigations.
- 2. Externally Set Assignment (40%) a shorter practical investigative project based on a topic selected from 12 set assignments provided by the Awarding Body. It consists of a period of research and portfolio development, followed by a period of 15 hours sustained focus study, to realise final outcomes.

Progression to year 2 will be dependent on successful completion of the first year taking into account Internal Progression Examination results and the Key Assessment Profile throughout the first year.

Fees and Financial Support:

This course is free for anyone aged 16 – 18.

College Maintenance Allowance (CMA):

Anyone with a gross household income under £35,000 can receive financial support to cover college related costs such as transport, meals, course equipment and uniform. Bursary support is based on individual circumstances and will be allocated to best suit your individual needs.
